## CURBSIDE FOOD PANTRY AVAILABLE NOW for eligible Lake County, IL residents

WAUKEGAN, IL - Curbside Food Pantry is available for income eligible families.

Community Action Partnership of Lake County has reopened our food pantry as a free food resource for eligible residents adapting to the COVID-19 pandemic stay at home orders. We are committed to helping families in Lake County during this pandemic.

We are offering Curbside Food Pantry services to adhere to social distancing and stay at home orders.

## **CURBSIDE FOOD PANTRY:**

1) The Food Pantry is open daily.

2) Lake County residents must call main number at 847-249-4330,

- Press #1 for Services, then
- Press #3 for CSBG food pantry, a case manager will assist in completing a basic intake application
- Calls must be between the hours of 9:00 am-4:00 pm

3) Once the application is completed, the recipient will be given a scheduled pick-up time Monday-Friday to go to the pantry to receive food assistance.

4) Note: Food has been pre-packed. Additional meat and perishable items will be added according to family size once the recipient arrives. Food will then be pushed out to the recipient's vehicle (curbside). A list of all other food pantries is provided as a resource on where they can go for additional food items.
