Mortgage Assistance for Homeowners Affected by Pandemic

The Illinois Housing Development Authority (IHDA) reopened a mortgage assistance program designed to assist homeowners financially impacted by the pandemic. The Illinois Homeowner Assistance Fund (ILHAF) provides up to \$30K in mortgage assistance to eligible homeowners—paid directly to the servicer, taxing body or other approved entity—while homeowners work to regain their financial footing. Whether homeowners have a mortgage, a reverse mortgage or are mortgage free, the program can fund past due housing payments and up to three months of prospective mortgage payments.

The program is free and funds do not need to be repaid. To learn more about who is eligible and for a link to the application, visit illinoishousinghelp.org. Applications will be accepted until 11:59 p.m. on Tuesday, January 31, 2023.


If you have questions or need help filling out the application, IHDA is offering free webinars in English and Spanish.

211 Results for Third Quarter 2022

United Way of Lake County's third quarter (Q3) report is **now available for download**. The report provides a quarterly snapshot of the demographic data and top community needs requested from Lake County's 211 between July 1 and September 30, 2022. The goal of this report is to share a quarterly overview of 211 data on top community needs and the populations we serve here in Lake County.

During this time, 211 received a total of **2,538** calls and texts with **4,749** needs requested. Additionally, **11,829** users visited the 211LakeCounty.org website with **14,522** web sessions. As compared to prior quarter, calls and texts increased 5.5% with a 20% increase in needs, and website visits increased 22%.

The top reasons people contacted 211 were:



"Housing & Shelter" remains the biggest category of need which increased 19% over the prior quarter. The top specific need within that category—Rent Payment Assistance—increased by 53%. The most significant increase in needs requested was for "Utilities" which grew more than 55% over the prior quarter.

Reports are compiled using anonymous data provided by the 211 Contact Center at Interface Children & Family Services and the 211 Lake County database, as well as website analytics. The reports are intended to assist with proactive community planning and informed decision making.
