National Immunization Awareness Month

August is National Immunization Month and a time to raise awareness about the importance of immunizations in protecting people of all ages from preventable diseases. With school starting, it's also a time to check vaccination records to see if your kids are up to date and that they head back to school safer and healthier this year. Be sure to consult with your child's doctor or nurse about their vaccination needs. You can also learn about routine vaccines and view immunization schedules by age on the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention website. 211 Advisory Council Meeting

The 211 Advisory Council met on August 9 for its quarterly meeting to review 211 program results from the previous quarter, including key metrics by goal, and trend information on 211 contacts and needs presented.

Tania Surane shared an agency spotlight on the Boys & Girls Club of Lake County. Kristi Long, Chair of 211 Illinois, provided an update on 211 statewide expansion efforts. Bobbi Zerfas, Program Director of Thresholds, provided the council with an overview of the Coordinated Entry System for Lake County. Bobbi is also the Chair of the System Coordination & Entry Committee for the Lake County Coalition for the Homeless. The presentation helped council members to better understand how individuals experiencing homelessness access services and shelter. The council also discussed the next steps on 211 marketing, community engagement and resource development.

Welcome to our newest advisory council members, Barbara Heischberg with University Center of Lake County, Edith Ruiz with ComEd an Exelon Company, and Tania Surane with Boys & Girls Club of Lake County. We

look forward to their involvement. The council will reconvene on November 8.
