Cook County Launches 211

211 services in Chicago and suburban Cook County officially launched on January 27, 2023, which means another 5.3 million people have access to 211 in Illinois! "With Chicago and Cook County now part of the 211 network, all Cook County residents are just one text, chat, or phone call away from an expansive database of incredible social services," said Sean Garrett, President & CEO, United Way of Metro Chicago.




We are thrilled to see 211 access continue to grow across Illinois which also means more seamless access for people living in our border communities and for those who live or work in neighboring counties.

Ride Lake County

Ride Lake County is a borderless countywide paratransit service that provides seniors age 60+ and people with disabilities transportation to any area of Lake County for work, shopping, medical appointments and more. As a reservation-based program, vehicles do not travel on a fixed route each day. Riders schedule their trips in advance and the vehicles provide curb-to-curb service from the rider's desired pick-up and drop-off destinations.

Registration

Before scheduling their first ride, residents must register through Pace by calling their call center at 1-800-201-6446. Residents can register as either a senior (60+) or as an individual with a disability. The Pace Call Center will ask for birthdate information for residents registering as seniors. The Pace Call Center will ask for an *RTA Reduced Fare Permit number for residents registering as an individual with a disability. Learn more about this at <u>lakecountyil.gov/RLC</u>.

Booking a Trip

Residents can call the Pace Call Center at **1-800-201-6446** daily between 5:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. to book a trip.

Riders can schedule a trip any day of the week from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. except for certain holidays. Riders can reserve a trip as far as seven days in advance or as little as two hours in advance.
