Our 211 Annual Report

Review 211's Four-Year Results and Impact

We are thrilled to celebrate the four-year anniversary of 211 services for Lake County! Check out our new 211 Annual Report for FY2023 that highlights our results and the growing impact that 211 continues to make in its fourth year of operation, including **79,088 connections to help**—a 38% increase in contacts over the prior year! This year, we answered 10,723 calls and texts, with 12,634 unique needs requested. In addition, 54,396 users visited the 211LakeCounty.org website with 68,365 web sessions.

The report is <u>now available for download</u> and provides a snapshot of the demographic data and top needs requested of 211 between July 1, 2022 and June 30, 2023. What's New on 'Charla con el 211'

Earlier this month, our 211 Ambassador Sara Martinez and radio host Jose Rodriguez spoke with Belen Martinez Gomez, Public Health Assistant with the Lake County Health Department and Community Health Center, about food assistance programs such as SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) and WIC (nutrition for Women, Infants and Children), as well as Medicaid, a federal and state program that helps you get access to critical health care and services. The monthly talk show series is broadcast on TUDN Radio WKRS 1220-AM and is livestreamed on Facebook. In case you missed it, you can watch the episode on Facebook.

Next up: Tune in to 1220-AM on October 10 at 9:00 a.m. and hear from Dulce Ortiz, Executive Director at Mano a Mano Family Resource Center, to learn about services and support for newly arrived asylum-seeking families. These families are dealing with food and housing insecurity, and often face a range of mental health issues many of which are related to the traumatic experiences they have endured in their home countries and during their journey to seek asylum. It's not easy for these families to seek help as they are unaware of local community resources to meet basic needs and don't immediately trust large institutions and/or government.
