Celebrating 211 Day 2024

211 Day is coming up soon! On Sunday, **February 11** (2/11), we'll not only be watching Super Bowl 58 but also celebrating the tremendous impact 211 has made in Lake County, including responding to more than 250,000 requests for help since its launch.

211 is the go-to, 24/7 three-digit resource that helps millions of people in North America get connected to information about available local resources and services. Last year, our 211 team compassionately answered 8,644 calls and texts from Lake County community members, with 12,493 needs requested and 16,744 referrals made, mostly for help with housing and shelter, utilities, food, employment and income support, and healthcare.

Starting next week, we will be posting on social media the many ways 211 provides help and hope every day. Will you share this information with your network? Let's continue to spread awareness of this vital community service and offer life-changing support to even more neighbors in their moments of need! 
211 Results for Second Quarter FY2024

We are pleased to share highlights from our new and improved second quarter (Q2) report which will soon be posted on our website under "Reports". The report provides a quarterly snapshot of the demographic data and top community needs requested from 211 Lake County between October 1 and December 31, 2023. The goal of this report is to share a quarterly overview of 211 data on top community needs and the populations we serve here in Lake County.

During this time, 211 received **2,137** calls and texts with **2,727** unique needs requested and **3,413** referrals made. Additionally, **16,283** users visited the 211LakeCounty.org website with **20,737** web sessions.

As compared to the prior quarter, calls and texts decreased by **21%**, with a **20%** needs decrease and a **16%** decrease in referrals. Website usage remained consistent during this period with a slight **1%** decrease in visitors and no real change in web sessions.

The top reasons people contacted 211 were:





Human Trafficking Prevention

Human trafficking is the act of compelling someone to work, for little or no pay, through force, fraud or coercion. Human trafficking can happen to anyone but some people are more vulnerable than others. Significant risk factors include recent migration or relocation, substance use, mental health concerns, involvement with the child welfare system and being a runaway or homeless youth.
