211 Lake County Community Awareness Survey Results


One of our goals has been to increase awareness of 211 within the Lake County community. To support this goal, United Way of Lake County recently partnered with the Center for Governmental Studies at Northern Illinois University to conduct our second community survey measuring awareness, usage, and opinions of 211.

Key Survey Findings:

- 34% of Lake County respondents indicated they have heard of 211, compared to 40% nationally.
- We are thrilled with this progress up from 21.5% awareness in 2022! Especially considering 211 launched in Lake County in 2019, while many other regions have had 211 services for more than 25 years.


Awareness by Demographic Group:

Awareness levels varied across different racial and ethnic groups in Lake County.




How People Learn About 211:

When asked how they would prefer to receive information about 211, respondents most frequently cited:



Perceptions of 211:

- 62% of respondents said they would likely use 211 if they or someone in their household needed help — including 32% who said they would be very likely to use it.
- 78% believe that 211 is valuable to their community.

These findings set an important benchmark for our future efforts. The results will help guide our marketing, community engagement, and planning as we work to expand the reach and impact of 211 in Lake County.

211 Results for Third Quarter FY2025


We're pleased to share highlights of our third quarter report. This report offers a snapshot of the demographic data and top community needs captured through 211 Lake County from January 1 to March 31, 2025. Our goal is to provide a quarterly overview of the critical needs identified and the populations we serve here in Lake County.

Key Highlights:

- 2,265 calls and texts received
- 3,333 needs requested
- 3,744 referrals made
- 18,030 web sessions

Compared to the previous quarter, calls and texts remained steady, needs requested increased by 4.5%, and referrals made rose by 16%. Website users and sessions saw a 15% decrease during this period.

Top Reasons People Contacted 211:



Comparison to Previous Quarter:

- **Increases** in unique need requests:
 - Housing & Shelter (+11%)
 - Utilities (+12%)
 - Employment & Income (+15%)

The 211 reports are generated from nonidentifying data from the calls, texts, website, and referrals.
