Connecting Job Seekers to Support

211 Lake County recently participated in job fairs hosted by the Lake County Job Center and Workforce Development. We partnered with local organizations to connect job seekers not only to employment opportunities, but also to essential wraparound services like transportation, healthcare, and food—helping remove barriers to success.

Engaging with Older Adults and Caregivers

At the Patricia Jones Center, our team led trainings with Spanish-speaking seniors, grandparents raising grandchildren, and the Waukegan Township Advisory Council. These sessions opened space for meaningful dialogue, addressed specific needs, and shared data on top community challenges.
