Agency Spotlight: A Safe Place

In honor of Domestic Violence Awareness Month this October, we're highlighting <u>A Safe Place</u>, the only organization in Lake County dedicated exclusively to supporting victims of domestic violence and human trafficking.

Through comprehensive programs, A Safe Place provides survivors with the resources they need to rebuild their lives, prevents future abuse through targeted abuser intervention, and educates the community on how we can work together to end these pervasive issues. By breaking the cycle of abuse, A Safe Place is helping to create safer, healthier communities for all.

Know Your Rights: Immigration Resources

Knowing your rights is essential if you encounter immigration enforcement. Thanks to nonprofits like HACES and The Resurrection Project, community members can access free multilingual guides and trainings with practical tips and tools to help navigate these situations.

Key Safety Tips:

- You have the right to remain silent: "I wish to exercise my right to remain silent."
- Do not share personal information or sign documents you don't fully understand.
- Ask to speak with an attorney: "I wish to speak with an attorney."
- If ICE comes to your home, ask to see a valid warrant before opening the door.
