Responding to Increased Community Needs

211 provides a real-time snapshot of the increased challenges that families across Lake County are facing every day. During the COVID-19 health crisis, we have already seen a significant increase in the volume of calls and texts to 211, as well as website visits, and the need for services continues to grow. Calls and texts have nearly doubled in the month of March.

In response, our 211 Contact Center has increased staffing and has been recruiting and onboarding trained volunteers to assist.

We have also added <u>COVID-19</u> information and community resources to our 211 website and scripts, as well as highlighted <u>current volunteer opportunities</u>.

FEMA Funding Under the Public Assistance (PA) Program

The President declared an emergency declaration for Illinois as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic response. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has designated all counties in Illinois as eligible for funding under the Public Assistance (PA) Program. Certain costs directly related to the COVID-19 response are eligible for FEMA Public Assistance reimbursement at a 75% federal cost share. Per the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA), the eligible organizations for this program may include state governments, local governments, private non-profit organizations and Native American tribes and tribal organizations.
