Now Includes 211

The Lake County Help mobile app developed by Linking Efforts Against Drugs (LEAD) now includes information about 211! Lake County Help is primarily youth focused and intended for community members to use when they need immediate mental health assistance or have a drug/alcohol abuse concern for themselves or a friend. The Lake County Help app provides access to a 24/7 anonymous text crisis line staffed by licensed clinicians, and is available for free download in the Google Play Store and Apple App Store.
