What United Way is Doing to Bring 2-1-1 to Lake County

United Way of Lake County's free, confidential, county-wide 2-1-1 service will become a reality in Spring 2019. The new referral service will connect residents to numerous resources – like shelter and housing options, supplemental food programs, services for veterans, health care and many other critical services to help improve and save lives – 24-hours per day, 365 days per year.

A 2-1-1 Implementation Taskforce has been created and recently held a kickoff meeting to review a framework for 2-1-1, including long-term strategic goals. Work groups for Service Delivery, Community Engagement, Disaster Information, Marketing and Fundraising have been assigned. These groups are meeting to review outcomes, assign tasks and create timelines to achieve our goals for a Spring launch.

Preparations are underway, including finalizing the contract with a potential call center, establishing the telephone infrastructure, building the database infrastructure, engaging partners in the community including emergency service providers, developing a comprehensive marketing and community engagement strategy, as well as developing a long-term strategy to ensure sustainability of the program.
